PSHEE AND THE NEW OFSTED FRAMEWORK

The personal development, behaviour and welfare judgement in particular bears direct relevance to schools' PSHE programmes, with inspectors judging schools on whether they successfully promote and support:

- employability skills so that pupils are well prepared for the next stage of their education, employment, self-employment or training
- understanding of how to keep themselves safe from relevant risks such as abuse, sexual exploitation and extremism, including when using the internet and social media
- knowledge of how to keep themselves healthy, both emotionally and physically, including through exercising and healthy eating
- personal development, so that they are well prepared to respect others and contribute to wider society and life in Britain.

In addition, the judgement on Leadership and Management measures the extent to which leaders, managers and governors provide a curriculum that has breadth, depth and relevance; which promotes equality, and diversity; which safeguards pupils' welfare; which raises awareness and keeps pupils safe from the dangers of abuse, sexual exploitation, radicalisation and extremism.
