Back in the lab!

This term has seen the Science department back in their classrooms after a year away. For some pupils this was their first time in a laboratory, for others it was a welcome return to practical work.

Year 8 looked at gravity and weight and testing properties of metals and burning fuels.


Year 9 experimented with gravitational potential and kinetic energy using marble roller-coasters, and looked at halogen displacement reactions.

Year 10 experimented with exothermic and endothermic reactions.


Year 11 looked at the electrolysis of aqueous solutions and metal salt displacement reactions.

Year 12 were using Chromatography to analyse different amino acids in synthetic blood samples.





This term has seen success for Kesgrave High's Year 10s in the Advanced Mathematical Support Programme Maths Challenge. This annual event saw schools from across England compete with two groups from Kesgrave High coming joint second.

Senior Maths Challenge

Congratulations to our Year 12 mathematicians, Joshua Reavell, Iris Lin, Finlay Abbott, Eashan Chauhan, Patrick Holland, Jack Reilly and Ismail Zuberi who took part the UK Mathematical Trust's Senior Maths Challenge in November. These challenges are designed to really get individuals thinking beyond the standard syllabus and this year was no exception, with questions such as:

A circle of radius r and a right-angled isosceles triangle are drawn such that one of the shorter sides of the triangle is a diameter of the circle.

What is the shaded area?

A $\sqrt{2}r$ E E $(\sqrt{2}-1)\pi r^2$ C $2\pi r$

D $\frac{\pi r^2}{4}$



Between them, Kesgrave pupils achieved two bronze certificates, two silver and two gold, with Patrick and Ismail making it through to the prestigious follow-on round, the Senior Kangaroo. This follows on from Iris's success achieving a bronze certificate in the UKMT Mathematical Olympiad for Girls. The level of these questions is pitched above the usual challenge level and isn't multi-choice! For example:

(a) Find all whole numbers x such that

$$(x^2 - 7x + 11)^{(x^2 - 4x + 4)} = 1.$$

(b) Find all whole numbers x such that

$$(x^2 - 7x + 11)^{(x^2 - 4x + 4)} = -1.$$

KS4 pupils will get to try their hand at the Intermediate Challenge in early February. In late April, KS3 pupils will have the opportunity to try to match Jacob West's achievement in last year's event, when he not only achieved a gold in the Junior Challenge, but went on to gain a merit in the follow-on Olympiad round.

KHS School Council in Take Over Day!

Members of the KHS School Council took part in the East Suffolk Council virtual 'Youth Take Over Day' where they listened to funding proposals from community groups across East Suffolk. They successfully negotiated with other schools to allocate £19,000 for worthwhile projects!

East Suffolk had asked organisations to apply for funding for projects that had the aim to help young people. Members of the School Council became a funding panel to decide and appraise which projects will receive funding. Over the course of the day, we gained a sense of what grants are and how funding is awarded. We also had to collaborate and negotiate with other schools from east Suffolk to decide how much to award!

Considering that District Councillors are allowed a budget of £7,500 each year to award to local causes, members of the School Council felt it was 'a real privilege' to have a large budget to award.

Imogen Oldman from Yr9 'I enjoyed putting my ideas into this event and being able to help decide where money could be allocated to help community groups.'

Evelyn Wheatley Yr7 'The way we chose how much to give to each charity was by a vote which was really good as we got to see and hear what people thought after each charity's idea was presented. This was a fair way to make sure everyone had a chance to give their view.

Darcey Peck Yr7 'I really enjoyed being part of a team and sharing my ideas with everyone as we decided where to donate the money. I felt I learned new things and it was a great life lesson to learn as we had to justify why we supported each community group's idea.

Fedra Inancsi Yr7 'I enjoyed letting people have the money they requested for doing things to help others in their communities, and giving other people chances to experience new things'

Elizabeth Tink Yr7 'It was very interesting and there were many good views from people in our room, and on Zoom. Some people agreed, and some disagreed so it was a mixed vote each time, but we got to hear each others opinions. I am glad I have joined the School Council because it is so much fun!'


proud! Among the team Kesgrave High School are known to be proactive and engaging so they're setting a standard for others to follow.'

Year 9 charity heroes



Norma Peake leaves Kesgrave High School at the end of this term to begin her retirement. She has worked in the school canteen for over thirty years and we will miss her very much. Not only does she do a wonderful job serving the students of Kesgrave

Eashan Chauhan, in Year 12 took the opportunity to interview her before she left to capture some of her insights and recollections from over the years today, but no doubt some our parents will remember her too!

When did you attend Kesgrave High School and when did you start working here?

I began school at Kesgrave Modern School in 1958 and left in 1962. I then started working in the canteen in 1989.

How did you come to work here?

I had a friend who worked in the kitchen, and she asked me what I was doing one day as there was a job going at the school canteen, but I said that I was babysitting. The next day, she asked me again, and so I decided to have a go and so I started doing the washing up. There weren't many people working here then and people didn't stay long. I originally thought that people were working on different shifts!

How has the menu changed over time and what was your favourite food?

The menu back then was very limited, and the food was very bland, like dry peas, which I used to flick around! My favourite food was Manchester Tart, which was a layer of pastry with jam, custard, and coconut on top. Nowadays, the food is much more varied with curries and spicy food popular with the students.

What were your favourite subjects at School?

I liked PE a lot, didn't mind English, but I definitely didn't like Maths!

What did the school used to be like?

The headmaster, Stanley Reeve, was quite strict and the bottom half of the classrooms' windows were frosted; he wasn't very tall, so you never knew if he was approaching!

There used to be a tuck shop that sold McVities chocolate biscuits, and in the summer, they sold sorbet ice creams – a luxury!

In the canteen, there used to be long tables, with a teacher on the end of each table. If you were lucky and there was anything left, then you could go back for seconds, which you can't do today!

When I was there, there were no flush toilets, and the toilets were outside in the cold. They were in a brick building and the boys and girls had different toilets.

How would you describe the students at the school now?

I would describe them as polite and well-behaved, although you do have the odd one or two that aren't.

What will you do now that you have retired?

I'll try and meet my friends more, and also look after my grandchildren.

We wish Norma a long and happy retirement and want to say thank you for everything you have done for the Kesgrave High School community over the years.


