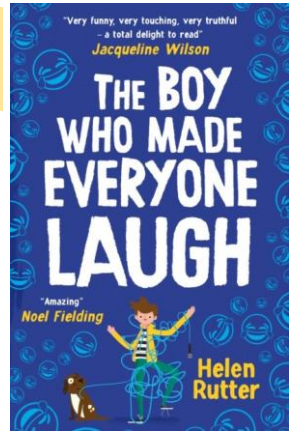


Year 6 Summer Book Transition Task

We hope you enjoyed reading *'The Boy Who Made Everyone Laugh'*. It's filled with themes about being brave, being different and finding yourself.



Diary Entry

Imagine that you are one of the characters in the book, aside from the narrator. For example, Skyla, Granny Bread, Matthew, Josh, Alex or Mr Osho. Write a diary entry from their point of view. You could include it from any part of the story you wish.



There are a variety of tasks on this page. Please complete at least **two** tasks and bring these in with you in September. However, if you'd like to complete more then please do!

Collage

Create a collage filled with words and images to represent a key character and their life or the key themes and ideas presented in the book as a whole.



Newspaper article

Write a newspaper article about a key event in the book. For example; your headline could be – **'Billy: The Funniest boy in the world!'**

- Include the what, where, why, who and how in your opening
- Include a quotation from someone in the book
- You could even include a description already used in the book



Enquire

The book is all about celebrating each other's differences and uniqueness. Pair up with a friend or family member and write down a list of all the things you know about them. Remember to add all the special things that makes them who they are. Share the list with the other person – is there anything either of you thinks should be added?



Dream

What is your big dream?
Write down a list of all the things you might need to do in order to achieve your dream.



Timeline

Draw a timeline that shows Billy's journey from his first day of high school to performing in the Christmas talent show. How did he get there? What almost stopped him? What encouraged him? What made his self-belief stronger?



Joke List

What are your favourite jokes? Write a list of the top ten funniest jokes you have ever heard. Share these with a friend or family member – what did they think? What was their favourite?



Word quest

Were there any words you haven't heard of or did not understand in the book?
Write your own dictionary with the word and definition and see if you can learn these words and use them when you join KHS!

Research

Find out the difference between different comedy styles such as 'observational' and 'one-liners'. Which do you prefer? What famous comedians use your preferred style? What is your favourite joke of theirs? Try writing your own joke using this style.



Asking For Help

In the book, Billy tries to hide his stammer and doesn't want to ask for help. Can you write down any advice that you would give someone like Billy who thinks they are different and believes they don't fit in.
